### **Sharing the tradition of women in music: a mission giving rise to a diverse repertoire**

Named in memory of Diane Peacock Jezic, pianist, music teacher, and author of Women Composers: The Lost Tradition Found, a leading work on women composers throughout history, the ensemble brings music composed by women or written for women performers to mainstream audiences. A diverse repertoire spans the ages and musical genre from classical to contemporary; blue grass to swing; international to gospel.

The Ensemble is committed to musical collaboration in support of these themes and will commission and premier new women's music.

Through musical performance and instructional programming, the Jezic Ensemble is committed to expanding awareness and understanding of women's music among children and other audiences.

### **Members from Baltimore area**

Thirty voices of women from the Baltimore area come together for six to eight concerts each season, plus frequent small ensemble performances. Singers bring talent honed as professionals, in community and sacred choirs, and other vocal music experience.
